DESCRIPTION

- 7b. Briefly describe the present physical appearance of the site or structure and describe any major alterations from its original condition:

A handsome, recently renovated neoclassic residence set amid large well cared for trees that add to the special character of Fifth Street. The structure is rectangular in plan with a low hipped composite shingled roof which is punctuated by a front gablet and a larger side triangular gable. Three handsome tuscan columns support the front veranda which is enclosed by narrow ship lap sheating in the balustrade. This same wooden skin covers the entire structure. A full raised basement sets the residence up seven steps up from the street level. Fenestration is very simple. Double hung windows fill the shallow angled front bay, while multi-light windows emphasize the entry ajacent to front gablet. This more correct version of turn of the century colonial revival contrasts nicely with the colonial revival/craftsman mix residence at 391 Fifth Street.
