A low gable roofline with exposed rafters and support brackets with an unusual square, flat projection over the front porch. The porch is also decorated with a curved entryway, elephantine pillars, a row of Spanish tile running across the front and a row of dentils near the roofline. The front door has sidelights and there is a low stucco wall around the porch with large square columns at the corners. The single story residence is sheathed in stucco with composition shingles on the very low gabled roof. Distinctive features include the unique chimney cap. Landscaping is well cared for through a little sparce.
