This small craftsman bungalow has the typical double gable roofline with latticework decoration at the top of the gables. It has exposed rafters with cut out ends and very craftsmanlike support brackets under the gables. The siding is narrow clapboard and the veranda porch is supported by square pillars. There is some trellis which extends from the end of the porch across the front of the house.

	SIGNIFICANCE 19. Briefly state historical and/or architectural importance (include dates, events, and persons associated with the site.)					
The booming years after World War I were centered around agriculture in the valley around Gilroy. Food processing and the various related businesses grew and brought additional population to the area. Many new residents were people who valued the natural feeling of bungalows and enjoyed the comfort of a California style. Gilroy has retained a full range of bungalow styles that are concentrated in the area, bound by First Street on the north, Fifth Street on the south, Monterey Road and Hanna Street. Within the context of this area are found homes of industry employees, merchants, bankers, doctors, and education. A full cross section of community life is still visible in the size, style and complexity of these residences. Olin C. Hadley was a teacher at Gilroy High School. Mr. Hadley became Superintendent of Gilroy Schools during the late 1930s and early 1940s.
